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On the first 5 months of second year of DUGEOR project by consortium members was elaborated prototype of Generic Dual Higher Education Model. This work was done after numerous interviews with consortium members, based on current documentation related to high education development done by different organizations for Georgia and experience gained in frames of consortium Georgian members visit in Germany, Austria and Serbia.

The conference on 26-27 June was some kind of overview of job done by consortium, planning future work and meeting with potential stakeholders. The conference was divided in two days: first day was Steering comittee meeting and demonstration of draft of program

to comitee, also discusion od draft of Generic Dual Higher Education Model, on 27 June on conference were invited GTU administration, company representatives who are potentially stakeholders and students from different programs. Both days were hold at the faculty of agricultural sciences and biosystems engineering, in Georgian Technical University. Practically all consortium members were participated during both days.

The Title of conference was: Develop a generic dual educational model for Georgia: perspectives and challenges.

During the first day – 26 June, GTU demonstrated part of equipment purchasing by DUGEOR project. GTU is planning to establish a dual educational bachelor's degree program in forestry and this equipment practically fully covers student's demand. At 10:30 started steering committee meeting, which was opened by Prof. Mirko Savic speech. He overviews progress that was made by the consortium and focuses on works which must be done in next few months. To the discussion were join consortium members from Georgian, Austrian and Serbian sides. During the steering committee meeting a draft of forestry bachelor's degree program was presented by GTU and National Forestry Agency.



27 June conference was opened by welcome speeches of Prof. Mirko Savic – project coordinator and Prof. Tamar Lominadze – vice-rector of GTU. Main presenters on conference were Hagen H. Hochrinner, - Manager/Teacher/Researcher FHJ and Ursula Goz – researcher DHBW. Both represented dual educational system, challenges and perspectives in EU. Next presenters were Levan Nebieridze – project manager from "Vengo group" and Giorgi Kvartskhava – GTU.

Based on experience from EU Member States and third countries associated to the Programme and needs of domestic industrial sector, the benefits of DUGEOR model on industrial sector with emphasis on improvement of competencies of dual students in higher education were presented to the stakeholders (students, academics, companies, policy makers, etc.).

The main conclusion from the conference is that there is a consesus about the necessity of introducing dual higher education into HE system of Georgia, but there is a lot of challenges, like working hours of teachers and their workload.
